

PRECIOUS POSSESSIONS

Craft Instructions Price for Rebellion Numbers 16

Materials:

- Tin can with a lid (1)
- Cardboard coaster or card board (1)
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Paint - brown and green
- Paint brush or sponge brush
- Cup for water
- Cups for paint or paint pallet
- Craft knife
- Cutting mat
- Scissors
- White glue
- Hot glue
- Brad (paper fastener)
- 7/8" (2 $\frac{1}{4}$ cm) flat button or a heavy circle of same size (for base)
- Large pony bead (1) (for turning handle)
- Card stock - white
- Optional: brown construction paper or card stock
- Craft Template A



Note: There will be no video for this week's craft.

Parent/Teacher preparation:

Print Craft Template A on white card stock.

Instructions for the craft:

- Color the people and tents on the template and cut out as 1 piece. The rectangle is a tab and does not need to be colored.
- Bring the edge of the people piece to the opposite side dotted rectangle and glue to make tube.
- Glue the bottom of the tube to the button so it has a base. The people piece can now stand on its own.
- Depending on the size of the can being used, it may possible to use the left over card stock for the next step, if not use brown construction paper or card stock.
- Measure your can from top to bottom.
- Cut a strip of either white card stock from the template or brown construction paper the height of the can so that there is enough to cover the outside of the can.

Instructions for the craft cont'd:

- Glue the strip to the can.
- If using white, then use brown and green paint to make it look like the ground.
- If using brown paper, you can use green paint to add texture to the paper.
- Take the button or the circle you are using for base, place it on the lid and trace around it.
- Cut out the circle you just drew with a craft knife or scissors to make a hole. Check to see if the button will go through easily and adjust to make hole bigger if needed.
- If using a cardboard coaster around the same size as the lid, repeat the steps above to create a hole to match.
- If using a cardboard coaster that is close to the same size as your lid, then, use the lid to trace a circle on a piece of cardboard. Cut out the circle.
- Repeat the steps for cutting hole on the cardboard circle.
- Poke a hole through the center of both the lid and your cardboard circle or coaster.
- Place the coaster on top of the lid and push the brad through both holes.
- Glue a pony bead in place opposite of the top hole on the coaster section.
- Put the lid on the can.
- Make sure that the holes are not one on top of the other.

The people and tent piece and can be placed on the hole on the top piece. Using the bead, turn the top circle until the holes meet. The people and tent piece will fall through the holes when they match up. Pretend they got swallowed by the ground as in the lesson.
