

PRECIOUS POSSESSIONS

Notebook Page Instructions Do's and Don'ts for Kings Deuteronomy 17:14-17

Materials:

- Card stock - white (2)
- Coloring pencils, crayons or markers
- Scissors
- Tacky glue
- Dimensional paint - gold and silver
- Optional: additional color dimensional paints for decorating crowns, jewelry, etc.
- Pen
- Notebook Templates: Main Page & B



Note: there will be no video for this week's Notebook Page.

• Parent/Teacher preparation:

The map for this Notebook Page is not an accurate Middle East Map. It is simply being used to differentiate between Yisra'el and other nations, so that it can be compared to what Yahweh expected of a king in Yisra'el vs. what other nation's kings did.

- Print Main Page & Notebook Template B on white card stock.

Instructions for the notebook page:

- Color all of the items on Notebook Template B.
- Cut everything out on Notebook Template B making sure to cut further down from feet to make a tab for the items to stand on the page.
- Use gold paint for the crowns and make some dots on one of the sets of sacks to make it look like they are filled with gold.
- Use the silver to make dots on the other set of sacks to make it look like they are filled with silver.
- Do any other decorating desired, then set everything aside to dry.
- Color the map making sure to color all of the land that belonged to Yisra'el one color and the other different nations in different colors.

Notebook Page - page 2:

Instructions for the notebook page cont'd:

- Cut 3 rectangles from the scraps and write the Hebrew words for this week:

- Check to make sure all of the items are dry.
- Draw some tzitzit on the king of Yisra'el.
- Fold the tabs back so that the items can be glued to the page.

Assembling the page:

- Using *Tacky glue* place the following figures on the Main Page as indicated:
 - the king of Yisra'el in the center of the land of Yisra'el
 - his wife next to him
 - the horse behind them or next to the king
 - the different Yisra'elites on different places along the land
 - the king with horses on the land under Yisra'el
 - the king with the pointed hat on the border line of the land on the right bottom corner and the land next to Yisra'el. Glue the men that do not look like him on the bottom right piece of land
 - the king with wives on the land next to Yisra'el
 - the king with the sacks of gold and silver on the land at the top right corner
 - the word 'sovereign' next to the king of Yisra'el
 - the word 'wives' by the king with many wives
 - the word 'horses' by the king with many horses

This is a visual comparing what a king of Yisra'el should not do that other nations did.
